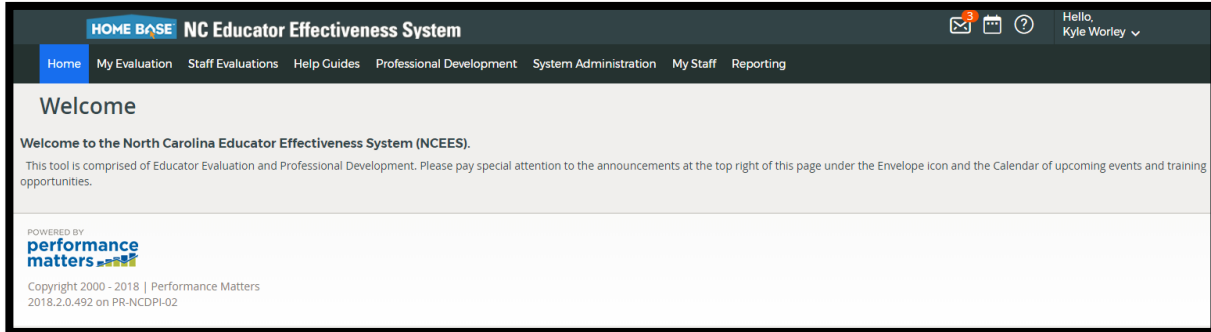


**Primary Audience:** Teacher

The following status icons can be found throughout the evaluation plan in the system. Keep these in mind when completing the activities within the containers.



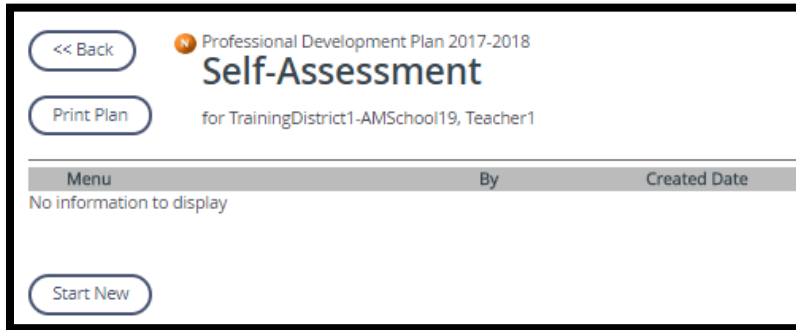
**Activity 1: Self-Assessment**

**Self-Assessment** needs to be completed and locked before the **PDP Initial Review** will open.

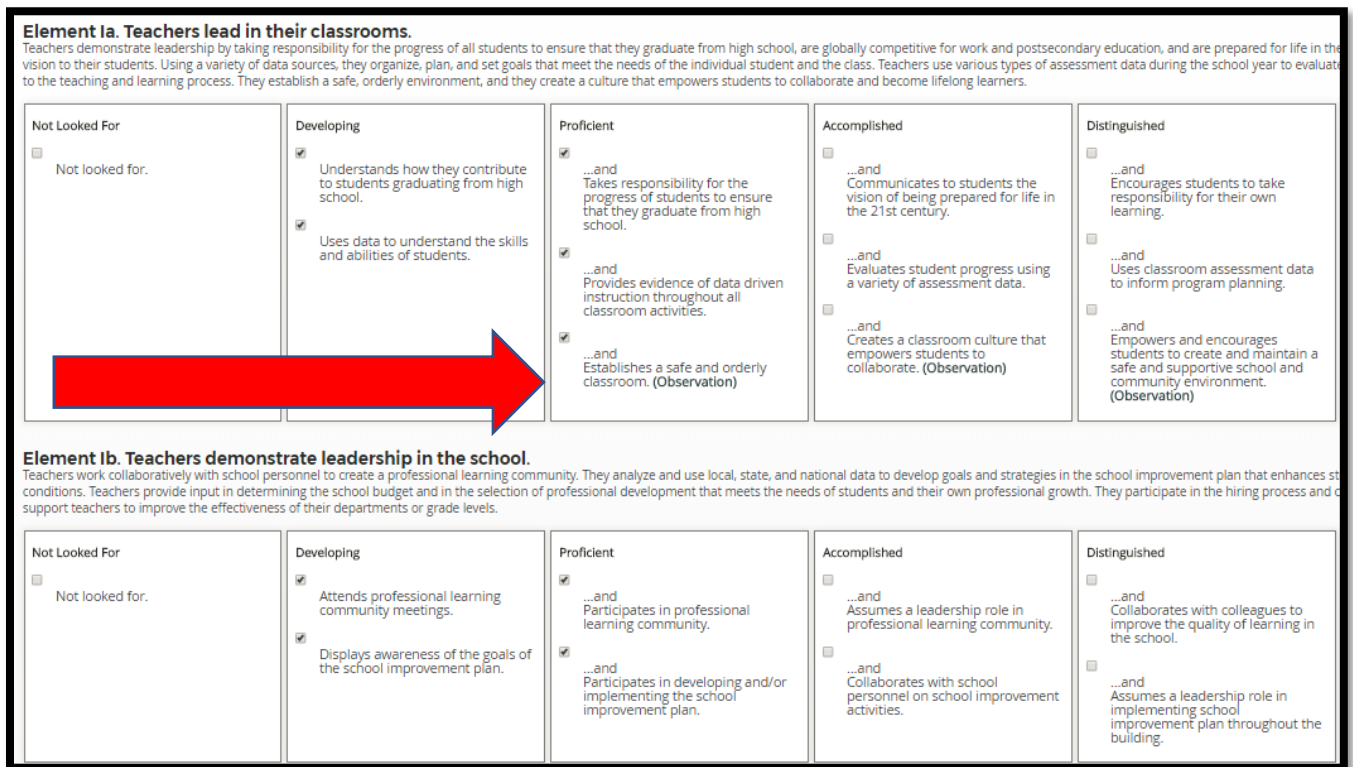
1. Click **Self-Assessment**

2. Go through rubric and **Click** on which indicators you are demonstrating for each Standard. Clicking left to right.

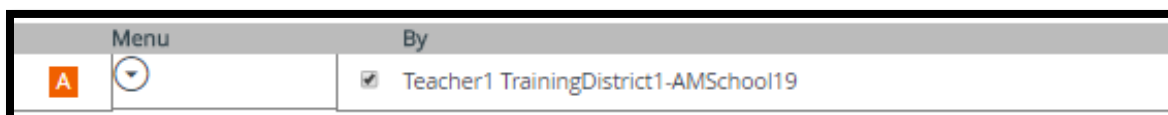


3. When you have marked all indicators Click **Save**

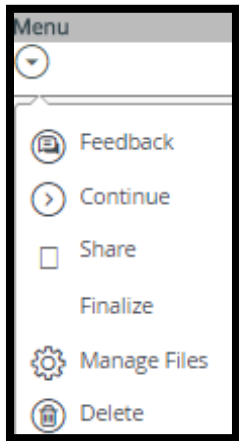


**Activity 2: Share Self-Assessment (optional)**

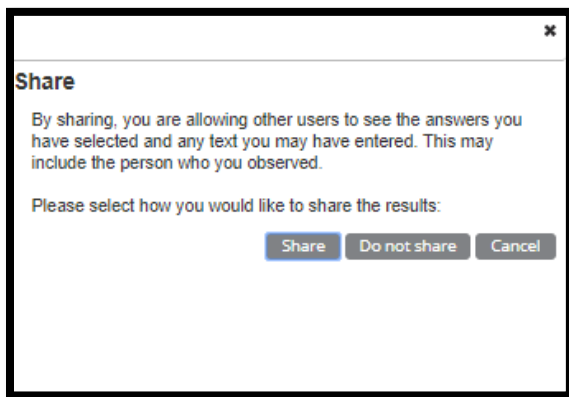
1. Click on **Menu**

3. Click **Share**

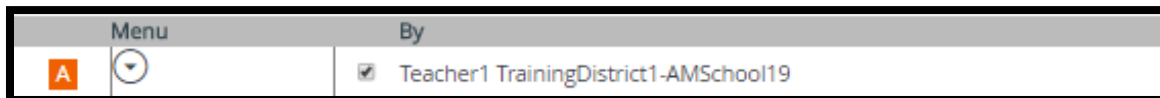

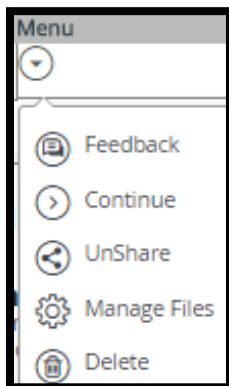

2. Click on **Continue**

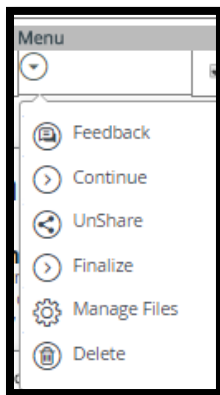


3. Go through rubric and make sure each indicator has at least one check.

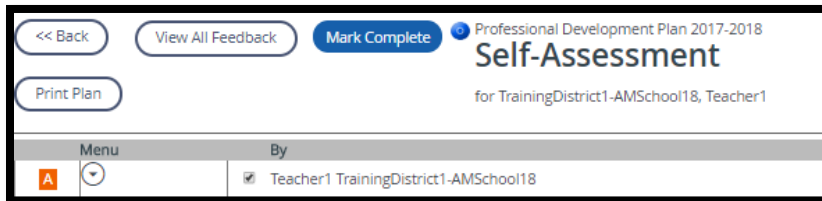
Element Ia. Teachers lead in their classrooms.					
Teachers demonstrate leadership by taking responsibility for the progress of all students to ensure that they graduate from high school, are globally competitive for work and postsecondary education, and are prepared for life in the 21st century. Teachers communicate their vision to their students. Using a variety of data sources, they organize, plan, and set goals that meet the needs of the individual student and the class. Teachers use various types of assessment data during the school year to evaluate student progress and to make adjustments to the teaching and learning process. They establish a safe, orderly environment, and they create a culture that empowers students to collaborate and become lifelong learners.

Teachers work collaboratively with school personnel to create a professional learning community. They analyze and use local, state, and national data to develop goals and strategies in the school improvement plan that enhances student learning and teacher work conditions. Teachers provide input in determining the school budget and in the selection of professional development that meets the needs of students and their own professional growth. They participate in the hiring process and collaborate with their colleagues to support teachers to improve the effectiveness of their departments or grade levels.
